The Secretariat of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) presents its compliments to the IAEA's Member States and has the honour to draw their attention to the International Workshop on Preparing for Implementation of Decommissioning of Nuclear Facilities (hereinafter referred to as "event") to be held in Tsuruga, Fukui Prefecture, Japan, from 11 to 14 November 2019.

The purpose of the event is to review all aspects of the detailed preparations for decommissioning of nuclear facilities.

The attached Information Sheet provides further details of the event.

The event will be held in English.

Member States are invited to designate one or more participants for this event. Member States are strongly encouraged to identify suitable women participants.

The IAEA is generally not in a position to bear the travel and other costs of participants in the event. The IAEA has, however, limited funds at its disposal to help meet the cost of attendance of certain participants. Upon specific request, such assistance may be offered to normally one participant per country, provided that, in the IAEA's view, the participant will make an important contribution to the event. The application for financial support should be made at the time of designating the participants using the attached Grant Application Form (Form C).

It should be noted that compensation is not payable by the IAEA for any damage to or loss of personal property. The IAEA also does not provide health insurance coverage for participants in IAEA events. Arrangements for private insurance coverage on an individual basis should therefore be made. The IAEA will, however, provide insurance coverage for accidents and illnesses that clearly result from any work performed for the IAEA.

Designations should be submitted to the IAEA through the competent national authority (Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Permanent Mission to the IAEA or National Atomic Energy Authority) not later than **20 September 2019** using the attached Participation Form (Form A). Copies should be sent by email to the Scientific Secretary of the event, Mr Patrick Joseph O'Sullivan, Division of Nuclear Fuel Cycle and Waste Technology, Department of Nuclear Energy (Email: P.OSullivan@iaea.org), and to the Administrative Secretary, Ms Shahnoza Arzikulova (Email: S.Arzikulova@iaea.org). The Scientific Secretary of the event will liaise with the participants directly concerning further arrangements, including travel details, as appropriate, once official designations have been received.

Should Governments wish, in addition, to appoint one or more observers to assist and advise the designated participants, they are kindly requested to inform the IAEA of the names and contact details of any such observers by the above date. In accordance with the established rules, Governments are expected to bear the cost of attendance of any observers they may send to IAEA events. Compensation is not payable by the IAEA for any damage to or loss of observers' personal property or for illness, injury or death occurring while travelling to or in connection with their attendance at IAEA events.

### **Information Sheet**

### Introduction

A significant proportion of the nuclear power plants currently in operation are more than 30 years old and will be withdrawn from service between now and 2050. The decommissioning of these facilities will represent the final step in their lifecycle. This will involve a wide range of activities, including shutdown and dismantling of the facility, removal of spent fuel and radioactive and hazardous materials, and regrading of the site such that it may be reused for other activities. Accordingly, there is an increasing

need for effective planning of future decommissioning, including provision of systems for management of relevant information from the operating phase and for development of personnel competent to work on future decommissioning projects. The increasing need for such personnel will, in many cases, not be fulfilled by existing workforces as the age profile of the current nuclear workforce is typically skewed towards workers in the later stages of their careers.

In light of the above it is important that owners / operators of nuclear power facilities:

- Establish and update regularly decommissioning plans and associated cost estimates which take account of a range of possible future decommissioning scenarios. As the facility reaches the end of its operating life a detailed plan based on the selected scenario will need to be developed as a condition of receiving regulatory approval to proceed with decommissioning.
- *Inter alia*, the detailed decommissioning plan and cost estimate will need to identify the major risks to effective project implementation and describe arrangements for their management. It will also identify strategies for management of spent fuel and radioactive waste arising from the decommissioning work.
- Provide information management systems which ensure that information needed for safe and
  effective implementation of decommissioning is identified and retained during the operating
  lifetime of the facility.
- Develop, and keep maintained at an appropriate level of detail, human resource plans associated
  with decommissioning implementation. Such plans may need to consider a range of future
  contracting scenarios involving the use of specialized organizations and companies that provide
  decommissioning-related services.

### **Objectives**

The main purpose of the Workshop will be to provide overview and to discuss current international practice and lessons learnt concerning the detailed preparation for the decommissioning of nuclear power facilities. Topics being addressed will include:

- Development of final decommissioning plans and associated cost estimates;
- Optimization of activities undertaken during the period immediately following shutdown, in preparation for decommissioning;
- Contracting and risk management strategies for implementation of decommissioning;
- Human resource planning for decommissioning; and
- Knowledge management for decommissioning.

The duration of the Workshop will be 2.5 days, with additional time 1 day, being allocated to the site visit of major nuclear facilities located in Fukui Prefecture which are currently in a permanent shutdown status.

### **Target Audience**

The Workshop will be of greatest interest to professionals involved in the detailed planning, implementation or oversight of decommissioning of nuclear facilities. The expected number of participants are up to 40 persons.

### Working Language(s)

English

### **Participation and Registration**

All persons wishing to participate in the event have to be designated by an IAEA Member State or should be members of organizations that have been invited to attend.

In order to be designated by an IAEA Member State, participants are requested to send the **Participation Form (Form A)** to their competent national authority (e.g. Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Permanent Mission to the IAEA or National Atomic Energy Authority) for onward transmission to the IAEA by **20 September 2019**. Participants who are members of an organization invited to attend are requested to send the **Participation Form (Form A)** through their organization to the IAEA by above deadline.

Selected participants will be informed in due course on the procedures to be followed with regard to administrative and financial matters.

### **Expenditures and Grants**

No registration fee is charged to participants.

The IAEA has, however, limited funds at its disposal to help meet the cost of attendance of certain participants. Upon specific request, such assistance may be offered to normally one participant per country, provided that, in the IAEA's view, the participant will make an important contribution to the event.

The application for financial support should be made using the **Grant Application Form (Form C)** which has to be stamped, signed and submitted by the competent national authority to the IAEA together with the **Participation Form (Form A)** by **20 September 2019**.
